## **University News**

As in the case across our country, most colleges and universities are physically closed due to Covid19. Both Va Tech and Ga Tech switched to online versions of their class work, but the lab classes suffered greatly. As we know, our metal castings programs are lab intensive. Both universities will continue on-line during the summer and are planning at this point to re-open this fall with some restrictions. This of course is always subject to change as we have found out.

## Va Tech News

## **MSE**

Although Va Tech remains on a full lock down with all building closed to everyone except essential personnel, the renovation of Holden Hall continues.

#### VT FIRE

The Kroehling Advanced Materials Foundry is closed due to Covid19. All teaching and research work in the building has stopped. Lab classes are being taught "virtual". Before the closures, the MSE Department hosted its first Materials Career Fair on March 2 and 3<sup>rd</sup>. A number of perspective employers attended including Howmet and SSAB. Hopefully, this will continue the next academic year and is a wonderful venue to meet and recruit students for internships and full-time employment.

Even though our annual meeting for Blacksburg/ Roanoke was cancelled, \$16,250 in scholarships were awarded to Va Tech students though the generosity of FEF and PCC. Our Piedmont Chapter scholarships will be awarded in September as classes resume.

This year our Chapter approved the purchase of a 30-gallon Investment Casting Plow Tank with a high shear mixer. The equipment is expected to be delivered to VT Fire on mid-July and will greatly benefit the Investment classes and research.

## **Ga Southern News**

#### Southern CORE

Georgia Southern is also on full lockdown. However, before this occurred an Open Foundry Night was hosted on Feb 27<sup>th</sup> with 20 guests across the community participating. On March 7<sup>th</sup>, the student group hosted the Women in Engineering Society demonstrating the metal casting process using their Foundry in a Box. As part of their on-line offerings, three industrial presenters were hosted. Matt Jacobs (MAGMA) presented Gating Design Optimization, Emily Shedlarski (Simpson) presented Green Sand Technology and Testing and Ted Graser (Brokk) presented Foundry Robotics. For the first time, our Piedmont Chapter awarded scholarships to Southern CORE students.

The foundry renovation has started. Their kickoff meeting was held on April 23<sup>rd</sup> and the current space has been cleared to allow for the construction work. The renovation completion date is currently September in time for fall classes. This renovation will triple the size of the current foundry as well as adding ferrous melting capability.

- Plant Engineering Award
- Energy Champion Award.
