The Materials Science and Engineering Dept is hosting its first ever Career Fair on March 2-3, 2020. As a number of our members know, these career fairs are a wonderful opportunity to meet, interview and hire summer interns and co-op students for your operations. It is also a good opportunity to evaluate full time hires. See more information in the attached flyer.

Part of our MSE Advisory Board recommendations was the implementation of a foundry 5S program. Doug Orndorff and Tony Stegall of Charlotte Pipe are providing guidance and assisting in this effort. Progress is being made with electrical work in process to eliminate the need for extension cords. The ethylene/water overflow tank is moving outside, and extraneous materials are being discarded. With the assistance of our Piedmont Chapter, the existing investment casting plow tank is being replaced by a more compact 30-gallon unit with a high shear mixer. Your Piedmont Board approved this purchase and we expect delivery early summer.

Our metal casting program continues to generate interest outside of the University. A group from the CIA visited the foundry and was impressed not only on the facility, but on our emphasis on experimental learning and communication (particular report writing and presentations). Casting technology engineers from the General Electric Aviation Group visited the foundry lab and gave a presentation on the various casting methods they utilize for their product. During this visit our students demonstrated casting of FeMnAl in both sand and investment molds. We would like to thank Conbraco for their donation of aluminum silicate powder.

Our Key Professor, Dr. Druschitz, is piloting a new course on Bladesmithing. This has become popular with students who are using these skills in several national contests.

Our students have also been busy, continuing to demonstrate our Foundry in a Box to area schools. In addition, two students attended the Magma University Experience program in Schaumburg II.

Our newest Piedmont Chapter University program has also been busy. AFS students hosted six aluminum pour demos to over 100 engineering freshmen students during the first week of spring semester.

The AFS student chapter hosted general information meeting for recruitment, six new members were recruited. The group now has 30 members.

The AFS students participated in the Eagle Preview open house event on Feb 1. The students showcased metal-casting to over 40 families with perspective students.

Four students and Dr. Mingzhi Xu attended the Piedmont chapter meeting held at Columbus, GA on 1/22 and 1/23. Dr. Xu gave an introduction talk about the metalcasting program at Georgia Southern and a technical presentation at dinner on nitrogen pickup control on induction melting steels. The group also toured Golden's Foundry and Wheelabrator.

Georgia Southern received a donation of a new custom-built gas melting furnace from L Haberny Company and Specialty Foundry Products. This expands the aluminum melting capacity from 20lbs to 60lbs. The furnace has been installed and the first heat was poured on Feb 11th.



Our students and Dr. Mingzhi Xu toured Carolina Metalcasting on 1/31. The group met with Jim Harwood, toured the facility and watched two heats. Carolina Metalcasting also helped to cast the refractory lid for the new non-ferrous melting furnace that Georgia Southern installed.



One AFS student also attended the MAGMA university experience workshop hosted at MAGMA headquarters.
